

What is Stronghold?

- Secure Web Server
- Based on Apache
- Available World-wide with full encryption
 - Developed outside the US
 - Has RSA license for use in the US



Web Encryption - SSL

- Was developed by Netscape
- Gives end-to-end security
- Certificates provide trust via third-parties
- Most servers implement SSL v3
- Requires use of patented algorithms



Web Encryption - TLS

- Standardised by IETF
- Based on SSL v3
- Does not require patented algorithms
- Will replace SSL
- Stronghold was the first server to support TLS




What is in Stronghold?

- Apache
- SSLeay
- modssl
 - Updates API functions to use SSL
 - Adds TLS/SSL, session cache
 - Hardware acceleration
- PHP2
- Management tools




Stronghold Architecture

Alternatives

- Free (but restricted in US)
 - Apache-SSL
 - mod_ssl
- Commercial (but US and Canada only)
 - Raven
 - RedHat Secure Server



Why Stronghold? C2 supports open source

- C2 has Core Apache developers
- Builds on proven technologies
- Stronghold ships with (most) source
- "modssl" will move to source
- C2 publishes Apache Week
- C2 organised this conference



Why Stronghold? C2 has security expertise

- C2 only does security
- C2 added TLS to SSLeay
- Stronghold was first server with TLS
- Advanced digital ID access control
- Memory based "session cache"
- Supports hardware accelerators




Why Stronghold? Proven product and support
