Avoid the risk

Stay at home on Friday and Saturday night

Don't drink alcohol



Stay away from women





- Open party every night, all night
- Social function theme "Animal House"
- Haze the pledges, they deserve it!
- Operate with reckless abandon
- We'll start the risk management thing next semester

Criminal Prosecution and/or Civil Litigation

Are you luckier than these guys?



- Matt Krull: member of Pi Kappa Phi at Oregon State
- Driver crashed van into a power pole after driving erratically
- Matt Krull suffered fatal injuries and died, November 1996

Criminal Consequences of Matt's Death

Robert Glover: bought the alcohol

- which led to the death of Matt Krull, found guilty of two counts of furnishing alcohol to minors
 - prosecutors were able to trace and obtain evidence of the purchase through a receipt of sale on the keg as well as pictures of people drinking at the party
 - served 1 year in prison (school by day, jail by night)

Civil Consequences of Matt's Death

Robert Glover: bought the alcohol for the party, car accident resulted. Matt Krull is dead. Robert paid \$50,000 toward the settlement

Josh Tharakan: driving the van that crashed and killed Matt Krull. He paid \$50,000



Big Brother/Little Brother Event

BAC was .38 at his time of death

Choked, vomited and bleed from alcohol poisoning and DIED

His brothers
 gave him the

Each served 30 days in jail due to criminal charges in death of Adrian Heideman

Combined settlement by members personally liable = \$500,000

Personal Action & Denied Coverage

 After a night of drinking, attempted to swim the length of a 437ft lake

Body found 34 feet from shore, five hours latter with a .13 BAC



Chad Meredith, 18 died of hazing November 5, 2001 Coverage was denied for the two additional individuals involved

 Actions were deemed separate from the fraternity and chapter

Consequences of Chad's Death

- The police and university determined the chapter and fraternity were <u>not</u> to be held liable and both entities were dismissed
- The dismissal left the two individuals alone as defendants and the jury found them liable for a \$12.6 million judgment
- On the night of Chad's death each of the three men made irresponsible decisions, these actions took the two defendants away from the coverage of the fraternity

Denial of Coverage

- Your fraternity is not a protector from personal responsibility or liability
- Coverage may be denied because actions are individual in nature or not within the scope of activities of the fraternity as a member, or if actions such as hazing are alleged the benefits of coverage may be excluded because of your actions



Chad Meredith Act in Florida

Signed into state law on June 7, 2005

Law against hazing resulting in serious injury or death, increased from a misdemeanor to a felony puni in prison over if the victim or



misdemeanor to a felony punishable by up to five years in prison, even if the victim consents

Putting someone at risk of injury will become a first-degree misdemeanor

Two Fraternity Members Convicted of Felony Hazing

Florida A&M Univ. January, 2006

- Former chapter president and members were accused of physically abusing a candidate over a four day period.
- Five members tried under the Chad Meredith Act for "serious bodily injury". Chapter President and Jason Harris received felony hazing convictions.
- Chapter President and Jason Harris sentenced to two years in prison.

Drug Use in the Chapter House

- A drug sting at San Diego State University led to the arrests of 95 San Diego State Students and the suspension of 6 fraternities
- Toronto police officers seized more than \$126,000 in illegal drugs and charged two men with trafficking during a raid on a fraternity house near the University of Toronto
- Fraternity members at the University of Illinois were arrested after police alleged the sale of drugs took place in the house. The chapter was believed to have knowledge of the use of illegal drugs and failed to take corrective action. The chapter had been in continuous operation for 98 years and lost its charter.





Other possible consequences

Expulsion from University, removal of degree

- Closure of chapter and/or expulsion from fraternity membership
- Garnishment of wages and/or personal property


Fraternity Liability Claim Total Paid or Reserved

Frequency of Losses Exceeding \$100K





- Deal quickly and appropriately with problem members
- Know, understand and discuss the Risk Management Policy

- Damage the credibility of members and/or the chapter and fraternity in regards to case
- Increase value of claim through payout and legal fees and expenses

- Lead a responsible life, with integrity and compassion


