At the age of 14 (1975), Lisa Rosen spent the summer as a volunteer at the Ny Carlsberg Glyptotek in Copenhagen, Denmark restoring shards of Etruscan and Roman Pottery from their vast collection. Her passion for antiquity had begun. Based in Rome from 1985-2000, she began as an apprentice and finally created her own company in Italy. She worked with Italian art collections, both private and public, specializing in oil paintings on canvas, oil/tempera on panel, murals and stucco works, marble and fresco, located at various churches and aristocratic palaces throughout Italy (including the Vatican; see list below). Lisa Rosen resides in New York City and often travels to work on location.

Particulars: Cleaning, consolidation, re-construction of missing parts and chromatic

reintegration. The restoration was completed in time for the Jubilee

celebrations of the year 2000.

Location: Chelsea Hotel, 222 West 23 St., New York City - 2000.

Object: Painted ceiling and decorated perimeter in director's office.

Subject: Oil on canvas attached to ceiling, gilded decorations and painted panels

(executed in oil) on upper wall perimeter.

Date: 1884.

Particulars: Due to heavy water infiltration the ceiling showed much damage; mold, salt

infiltration and missing decorations. The central oil painting on canvas

showed 115 years of grime and yellowed varnish making the subject illegible.

Location: Collection of Count Roffredo Gaetani, New York City - 2000.

Object: Cycle of five French tapestries (family heirlooms) XVII cent.

Particulars: The tapestries had been poorly stored and badly damaged. The restoration

made hanging the completed work possible at the Ferrari headquarters,

Glencove, Long Island, N.Y.

Location: Waldorf Astoria Hotel, New York City - 2000.

Subject: Painted piano (turn of the 20th cent.), owned by Cole Porter.

Object: Sides of piano painted with floral decorations and gilding, piano top painted

with a lyrical scene.

Particulars: The piano was in dire need of cleaning and retouching of most of the painted

decorations. It is now on display at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel.

Location: Italian Charities of America, Elmhurst, N.Y. - 2003-04

Subject: 25 feet by 14 feet oil painting donated to the Charities in the 1930's by Mrs.

Astor. "Christopher Columbus being Presented at the Court of Ferdinand and Isabelle" was started in 1887 to be included in the 1892 Chicago World's fair.

Date: 1887 - 1907.

Object: Located in the ballroom of the Italian Charities, the enormous painting

(measuring 25 feet in length by 14 feet in height) had been treated very

poorly in the past. It was necessary to remove the altered varnish, strip line

the canvas and fill-in and retouch approximately 35% of the canvas.

Particulars: A new enclosed stage area has since been built to display the newly restored

work. Eleven smaller canvas studies for the painting are also on view there. Originally given to Lisa Rosen as nine studies, Rosen discovered two hitherto hidden works underneath two of the studies (sharing the same stretchers). An

award winning restoration (see above page 1).

Location: Italian Consulate, Park Ave., N.Y.C. - 2003.

Subject: Francesco De Mura: two oval oil-on-canvas paintings depicting playful cupids.

Date: Mid to late 18th century.

Object: Removal of heavily altered varnish on the paintings' surfaces. Re-application

of protective varnish.

Location: Private Manhattan residence of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Luce III (ie. Time

magazine), N.Y.C. - 2004-05

Subjects: Balthus' "The Cherry Picker", Courbet's "Young Girl by a River" and Corot's

"Ruins on a Cliff"

Objects: All three oil paintings on canvas were in dire need of cleaning.

Particulars: The Corot had a rip in the surface of the canvas. Also restored from the Luce

private collection: Four Chinese Han dynasty funeral ceramics, slight chipping

and cleaning necessary.

Also: The Luce Summer residence on Fisher Island.

Objects: Cleaning of 7 oil paintings of various periods, 2007

Location: The Church of Saint Ignatius Loyola, 940 Park Ave., N.Y.C. - 2004.

Subject: The Fourteen Stations of the Cross - mosaic cycle made by Salviati and Co.,

Venice, Italy, 1880's and sent complete to New York City.

Object: Cleaning of the enameled glass mosaics located on the north and south aisles

of the church and replacement of missing tesserae. The story of the cleaning

was written for an article in the New York Times dated March 7th, 2004.

Particulars: Award received for excellence in restoration from the "Friends of the Upper

East Historic Division" - 2005.

Location: The Church of Ignatius Loyola, 940 Park Ave, NYC., 2004

Subject: The 3 mosaics of the main altar same as above. Award received from the

"Friends of the Upper East Side" organization category-Best restoration of

2004.

Location: Church of Ignatius Loyola, NYC -2008
Subject: Marbles and mosaics of the Baptistery

Object: Cleaning and restoration of the glass tesserae and the marble surrounds.

Location: Old Infirmary, Yaphank, Long Island, N.Y. - 2005.

Subject: Two painted oil on canvas murals located in the auditorium.

Object: Due to recent faulty electrical work the two wall murals had been badly

damaged. Also necessary was a complete removal of altered varnish.

Date: WPA murals dated 1938 and signed Gaston Herbert lower left corners of both.

Location: Union League Club of New York, Park Ave and 37th st.,- 2007

Subject: Restoration/cleaning of 14 oil paintings on canvas including 4 works by

Emanuel Leutze and 3 by Eastman Johnson.

Object: The paintings have been at the club on view for the past 130 years and had

never been cleaned. We brought the original radiance back to these

previously sad paintings.

Location: Church of the Transfiguration (aka Little Church Around the Corner), 1 East

29th street, NYC 2008-2010

Subject: "14 Stations of the Cross" oil on board

Object: Restoration and cleaning (removal of old altered varnish, etc.)

Location: Private collection of John Richardson, author and world renowned Picasso

specialist.

Object: Various and ongoing restoration of his personal painting collection.
