#### **CHAIR'S REPORT**

Welcome old friends and new to our annual report for the financial year ending March 2008.

If this is your first time reading about us, here is a bit of background: Haven Distribution believes in the transformational power of education. We believe that prisoners, given a positive educational environment and the tools for change, can work toward their own self-development, assisting in their resettlement upon release.

Since 1996, with the help of several generous donors, we have been providing UK prisoners with the tools for this educational transformation – books: from fiction for personal reading to textbooks and dictionaries to assist learning.

The financial year 2007-2008 was, as always, a busy one. The Trustees made the decision to move the day-to-day operations of Haven to a larger office in Bristol in early summer 2007, which is just as well, as we received a massive donation of business books from the London School of Economics shortly afterwards. This influx of free educational material provided us with an excellent reason to publicise Haven again in *Inside Time*, a newspaper distributed widely throughout the prison estate. This publicity encouraged prisoners in education, who we had not provided with books previously, to apply for educational books, but also encouraged prisoners without the opportunity to undertake formal education to contact us for reading material.

Of course, this contributed to the always-increasing demand for Haven's services. The growth of the prison estate to unprecedented numbers presents a huge challenge to all the charities working with prisoners, and we are no exception. The Trustees decided that it was time for Haven to seek out funding to employ a Project Worker, as it was becoming increasingly difficult to manage the service with volunteer time only. I am very pleased to say that the Tudor Trust worked with us to develop the idea, and we received word, near the beginning of the new financial year, that they would be able to fund our new plans.

I hope that the Annual Report for 2008-2009 will be filled with exciting news about the difference being achieved in prisoners' lives through education and reading, thanks to the generosity of Tudor and our existing funders, the JJ Charitable Trust, and of our loyal individual donors.

As always, we hope to increase the number of educational books going to the women's prisons, while keeping up with the demand of supplying books to the ever-expanding male prison population. We are also faced with the new challenges of the increased cost of books, as well as sourcing reliable suppliers of dictionaries in non-European languages. I am confident that we will rise to these challenges, not only because we have to, but because of the excellent support we receive from so many of you.

## ETHNICITY, DIVERSITY and the ENGLISH LANGUAGE

Almost 60% of the books we send are bilingual dictionaries to prisoners studying literacy or ESOL. The majority of the almost 900 dictionaries we sent this year were English or Spanish, and a significant number were Arabic and Chinese. There has also been a noticeable increase in requests for dictionaries in Vietnamese, as well as in various African languages, though we are often unable to source affordable editions of these dictionaries quickly enough to supply them to the prisoners.

#### **EDUCATIONAL COURSES**

We sent almost 1500 books to prisoners in education between 1<sup>st</sup> April 2007 – 31 March 2008; these textbooks were requested more often than others:

Essential Grammar in Use – Maths: The Basic Skills – Practical Cookery – Pass Clait Plus – Psychology for AS Level – Hillier's Fundamentals of Motor Vehicle Technology I

The prevalence of these titles, combined with the sheer bulk of dictionaries provided, paints an interesting picture of the courses undertaken by the majority of the prisoners using Haven's services, confirming the widely used statistics that many adults in the prison system need help improving their literacy and numeracy skills, as well as confirming that many prisoners are intent on using their time in custody to improve their employability upon release by learning practical skills.
