A Little Help With A Tough Job.....

Calling spots is one of the hardest jobs in lighting.

You're responsible for the performers being seen, calling the spots to make sure everyone looks great, at the same time writing it all down ready for when the show goes on tour and a new crew have to learn it all anew - often, when touring, over the first performance.

Strangely, there's never really been a tool made to help with making the cuesheets - tracking the cues, writing it all down, printing it for the operators in a clear, easy-to-read format, revising it during rehearsals, printing again.

Everyone's made their own, in Word, in Excel, in a host of other programs really designed for writing essays or doing accounts.


Now there is a tool: **SpotTrack**.
